*2. Write a good introduction that captures the reader's attention.  
(easy way out: refer to the question)*

3. *At the end of the introduction, state your **opinion**.*  
(topic sentence)

4. *In the next paragraph, give a **reason** for your opinion.  
(= Why do you think so?)*

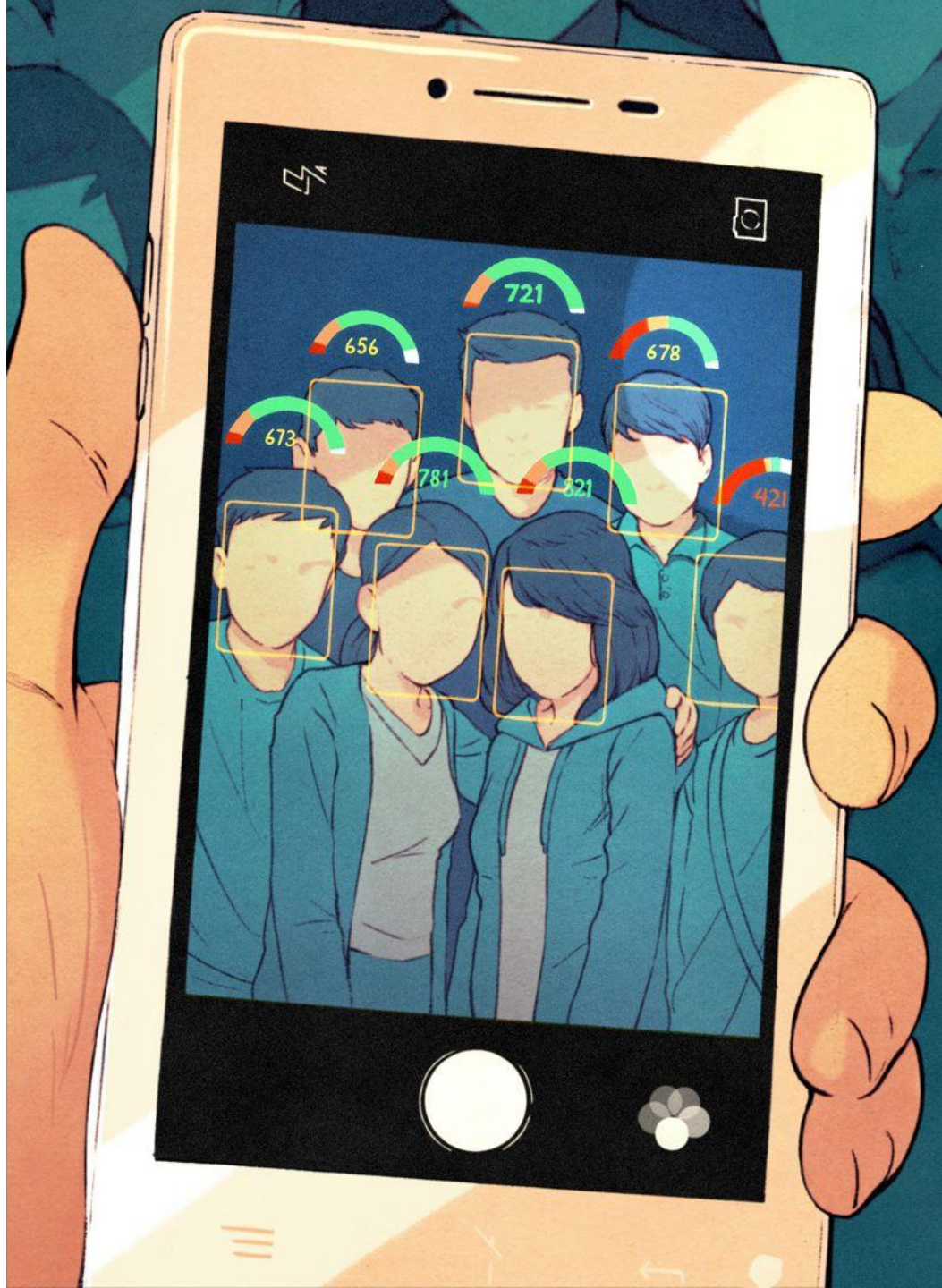
